102.00 ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE

102.01 **Policy**:

- •The Chief of Police must necessarily limit the number of departmental members who report directly to his office. Therefore, to ensure unity of command, clearly defined lines of authority must be delineated. The establishment of these lines of authority comprise the structural relationship between each departmental member and the Chief of Police.
- Organization may be defined as the arrangement of personnel and other resources in such a manner as to facilitate the accomplishment of identified goals and objectives.

102.02 Definitions:

- <u>Division</u>: A primary subdivision of the Office of the Chief of Police. A
 division has a department-wide function for a generalized police service.
 A division is commanded by a Deputy Chief.
- <u>Section</u>: A functional subdivision within a division having a departmentwide responsibility for providing a specialized function.
- <u>Watch</u>: A subdivision of a division having a temporal responsibility for the provision of general police uniformed patrol operations.
- <u>Unit</u>: A subdivision of a section. The unit is usually small in size with personnel assigned to perform a specialized activity. A unit may have department-wide responsibility for a specialized function.
- <u>Component</u>: A subdivision of a unit that is staffed by at least one employee on a full-time or part-time basis to provide a specific function that supports the specialized activity of the unit.
