

507.00 OUT OF JURISDICTION ARRESTS

An officer may make an arrest beyond his jurisdictional boundaries in the following situations:

- To execute a valid arrest warrant. The officer will notify his supervisor and have the jurisdiction's police agency respond to assist with affecting the arrest.
- While engaged in fresh pursuit as sanctioned by C.R.S. 16-3-106:
 - The officer has probable cause to arrest or has knowledge of a warrant ordering the subject's arrest.
 - The officer is engaged in continuous pursuit of the subject after initiating the pursuit of the offender in the officer's jurisdiction.
 - Under mutual agreement. The agreement extends the same authorities to the officer as bestowed in his own jurisdiction.
 - When another agency has requested temporary assistance during a state of emergency pursuant to C.R.S. 29-5-104.
- As authorized by State Statute:
 - Sworn police officers of the Greeley Police Department are authorized to conduct arrests for situations being committed in the officer's presence when the situation is occurring outside the officer's employing jurisdiction under the following guidelines:
 - For any felony or any misdemeanor involving the threat of bodily injury when the officer is on duty, or
 - For felony crimes involving the threat of serious bodily injury or death, when the officer is off-duty.
 - The officer making the arrest will ensure the following is accomplished:
 - The local law enforcement agency having jurisdiction over the situation shall be immediately notified of the arrest.

GREELEY POLICE DEPARTMENT

- Any person so arrested shall be released to the custody of that agency having jurisdiction over the situation upon their arrival on scene or as soon as is reasonably practical.
- Officers making such arrests will make reasonable efforts to preserve the crime scene and related evidence and detain witnesses until the arrival of the agency having jurisdiction.
- Following such an arrest, the officer(s) involved will prepare a police report of the incident as soon as practical, a copy will be provided to the agency having jurisdiction.
